Terms and Conditions

Battles for Victory is a family show with the minimum of rules and restrictions. However, co-operation with our simple safety and legal requirements is essential. We greatly appreciate your co-operation in working with us to achieve the high standard we aim to meet and look forward to your support.

5 M.P.H. SPEED LIMIT

A speed limit of 5 m.p.h. is applied within the showground. No unauthorised moving of vehicles during events. Drivers are to obey instructions from Officials. No transference of fuels to be carried out. Under Section 1, 2 and 3 as amended by the Road Traffic Act of 1991 you could be prosecuted for driving recklessly at this type of event.

VEHICLE MOVEMENT

Vehicles are not permitted to leave the site between the hours of 9:00am and 5:00pm on show days. Emergencies excepted.

GENERATORS

Generators must conform to the current Health and Safety Regulations and the Electricity at Work Act. This includes ground spikes (earthing). Any cost incurred ensuring that your generator complies with current legislations will be at your own expense.

WEAPONS

Only vehicle mounted weapons or those as part of a static display will be allowed on site. These must remain secure at all times and must comply with current H.M. Government Regulations. No weapons are to be carried around on the site without prior authorisation from the Organisers. **NO BLANK ROUNDS** or **PYROTECHNICS** may be brought on site unless pre-arranged with the Organiser. In the light of public opinion, the Organisers must insist that **ALL WEAPONS** brought onto the site for display or sale must comply with **CURRENT U.K.** legislation. Anyone found to be disregarding this request will not be re-invited to attend. **No BB guns or air rifles to be used on site except in any designated organised ranges.**

ANTI-SEMITISM

The display of anti-Semitic literature and artifacts is strictly forbidden at our show. If any of this material is found you will be asked to leave the showground and will not be welcome back.

UNIFORMS

There are no objections to the wearing of ALLIED uniforms, providing no decorations or badges of rank are worn to which the wearer is not entitled. AXIS uniforms may be worn as part of a static display or an arena event. The Organisers would appreciate your co-operation in the above.

NOISE

Unnecessary noise is restricted from 6:30pm until 9:00am the next morning; this includes sirens, gunfire, pyrotechnics and music.

OPEN FIRES AND BBQ's

Open fires on the ground are strictly forbidden, any damage to the ground via open fires will be repaired at the camper/traders costs.

FOOD CONCESSIONS

Only food and drinks will be allowed to be sold on site by those agreed with the Organisers. All food hygiene certificates and Gas/PAT certificates must be up to date and copies sent to the organisers with your booking forms.

TRADERS

Traders must not sell items that are either illegal or that the Organisers deem inappropriate for a family event. Alcohol may be included in raffle or tombola prizes but must be handed to a responsible adult, never to anyone under 18 years of age. All traders must have £5 million public liability or third-party risk insurance. Documentation is to be available for inspection at any time by the show Organisers or Health and Safety Officers. Due to Health and Safety, stallholders must be equipped with a fire extinguisher on their pitch at all times. all on site sleeping **MUST** be fitted with a working smoke detector. **Vehicles are not permitted to leave the site between the hours of 10:00am and 5:00pm on show days.**

SALE OF WEAPONS

The display and/or sale of deactivated weapons at the show is allowed if the vendor or owner has a British proof house certificate of deactivation. The certificate should be attached to the weapon or ready for inspection by the Police. Replica guns or guns manufactured solely as blank firing devices can be sold or displayed.

Live firing, blank ammunition or pyrotechnics are not allowed to be displayed, sold or brought into the showground. The display and sale of inert explosive devices is only allowed if the vendor or owner can demonstrate that the item has been previously dismantled to prove that it is free from explosives. The item must have a label attached to declare that it is free from explosive material. The Show Organisers do not accept any responsibility or liability for the inspection of the device.
